PASTOR'S NOTES

9/11 - Never Forget

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace and Joy in Our Lord Jesus Christ!

I had just finished offering the 6:15am Mass at Ss. Simon and Jude Cathedral. I returned to the rectory for breakfast. When I walked into the kitchen, I heard Fr. Frank watching the news on the television in the living room. I will never forget that feeling of helplessness and fear as I watched the planes fly into the twin towers in New York. This experience would forever shape the history and the landscape of our country and our world. Life would never be the same.



Years later, Pope Francis would confront world leaders by addressing a war and violence happening in Syria and elsewhere with prayer and fasting. He asked the faithful and all who have ears to hear: "How many conflicts, how many wars have mocked our history?" He went on to offer these thoughts: "Even today we raise our hand against our brother... We have perfected our weapons, our conscience has fallen asleep, and we have sharpened our ideas to justify ourselves as if it were normal we continue to sow destruction, pain, death. Violence and war lead only to death."

Our Holy Father was speaking clearly and directly as he asked everyone to not add to our brothers and sisters' heartache. "Can we get out of this spiral of sorrow and death? Can we learn once again to walk and live in the ways of peace?" "Invoking the help of God under the maternal gaze of the Salus Populi Romani, the Queen of Peace, I say yes it is possible for everyone. From every corner of the world tonight, I would like to hear us cry out: Yes, it is possible for everyone!"

Pope Saint John Paul II once addressed the world concerning the 9/11 attacks:

"Violence begets violence. That is why war should always be considered a defeat: the defeat of reason and of humanity. May a new spiritual and cultural thrust soon lead humankind to banish war. War never again!"

Our Lord is challenging us through the Holy Father to embrace a more in-depth response, one that involves responding to the "misery, desperation and the emptiness in hearts." May we have the courage to listen to His voice and find ways to heal and live in peace.

September 11th does not pass in the calendar without our remembering. We remember the 2,977 men, women, and children who lost their lives in New York City, Washington, DC, and Shanksville, PA on that tragic day. We remember images of death and destruction. Images that human eyes were never meant to see. We remember words our ears were never meant to hear, the tender last words of husbands and wives who would never embrace again.

We imagine the feeling of emptiness in the arms of children who at the end of the day could not find mom or dad for their welcome home hug. We remember our own feelings of emptiness as our sense of security, as our own confidence in the predictable order of life and work was radically shaken.

We remember the heroism of the many that lost their lives in saving others. We remember all those who suffered and died, we grieve for them still, friends and strangers alike, along with their families and friends.

And it is right that it should not pass from our memory. But today, along with our remembrance of profound loss, it also seems right that we give voice to our deep longing for peace, and with this prayer, commit ourselves to those actions that will draw us closer to our most ancient and most holy desire, peace among all God's children.

Dona nobis pacem.

Lord, grant us peace. Amen

Notes on the St. Bernadette Sanctuary Renovation

PART 21 - FR. PETE ROSSA (1964-2017)

Born: Oct. 23, 1964
Ordained: June 7, 2003
Assignments: Parochial vicar at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Scottsdale and St. Timothy, Mesa; pastor at St. Bernadette since 2007.
Died: Sept. 13, 2017

Fr. Pete Rossa collapsed during morning Mass on September 12th at St. Bernadette Parish in Scottsdale. Fr. Rossa died the following day. He was 52.

It is hard to believe that it has been five years since Fr. Pete's birthday into eternal life. His journey home began many years before.

Fr. Pete was ordained to the priesthood in 2003 when he was 38 years old. In a fairly atypical way, Fr. Pete found his way to the seminary soon after he came into the Catholic Church. As his Vocation Director, I recall his zeal for the Catholic faith, his love for Our Blessed Mother, as well as his sincere desire to serve God as

a priest. He was a wonderful seminarian because he knew God loved him and he wanted others to know God loved them too.

Fr. Pete also loved our country. He served in the military for several years in the Air Force. Perhaps his sense of duty and service that he found in the military enable him to hear Our Lord calling him to a life of service in the Church as a Catholic priest.

His vocation to the priesthood was obvious to those who were blessed to get to know him. Someone once referred to Fr. Peter as "a modern-day missionary, bringing people closer to Jesus Christ."

As part of his vision for bringing others to Christ, Fr. Pete devoted much time and energy to building a beautiful church of St. Bernadette. His dedication and desire to build something glorious for God was fulfilled exactly 13 months prior to his death. At the dedication, Fr. Pete reminded us all of his humility and his faith.

"IF I WERE TO DIE TOMORROW, IT WOULD BE MY SINCEREST HOPE THAT I NOT BE REMEMBERED FOR THIS CHURCH, BUT THAT I WOULD BE REMEMBERED FOR BRINGING YOU CLOSER TO JESUS CHRIST BECAUSE THAT IS OUR MISSION, THAT IS OUR HOPE, THAT IS OUR LONGING AT THE CORE OF OUR FAITH" Fr. Pete Rossa, Dedication of the Church).

His words rang true in the lives of those who knew him. His humble desire to bring people of all ages to know and love Our Lord was his number one priority. God calls people to be saints and Fr. Peter dedicated his life and his priesthood to bringing others closer to Jesus Christ.

Ambria Hammel, in an article for the Catholic Sun recalled "Countless comments and memories the faithful shared on Facebook describe St. Bernadette's new church and how Fr. Rossa ensured that every detail pointed people back to God." She recalled the experience others had with Fr. Pete. One person said that Fr. Pete "had no problem hearing a confession before a bride walked down the aisle." Others noted that Fr. Peter "had sharp paintball skills and let no obstacle prevent him from helping lead people, teens especially, closer to Christ."

Fr. Pete's dedication and willingness to serve without counting the cost was evident in his service to young people. Several people recalled his first Life Teen retreat with St. Bernadette. Fr. Rossa was playing basketball and somehow injured his Achilles tendon



prior to the retreat's Mass and Adoration. Youth leaders wondered what they would do without a priest, when low and behold, they got an email saying he was on his way back from the hospital, crutches and all.

Fr. Rossa's strong principles and love for Our Lord and His Church enabled him to serve with courage and conviction. Fr. Pete once said that "the devil's far more afraid of a priest than a priest is of him. ... Don't be afraid to pray with your people ... take courage in Jesus."

Fr. Pete has run the race and he has fought the good fight. Well done good and faithful servant.

As part of the parish's way of honoring this humble man of God, a "Memorial Cabinet" will be set as a permanent fixture in narthex of our church. While the exact details are yet to be determined, the hope is that it will look something like the depiction below. The

cabinet will contain several meaningful items including his chalice and paten as well as the rosary that belonged to his family and the amazing story of how Fr. Pete received that family rosary. This cabinet and the grotto (that we are hoping to begin sometime after the church is complete) will be a fitting way to commemorate this wonderful man of God.

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord,
and let perpetual light shine upon him.
May the souls of all the faithful departed,
through the mercy of God, rest in peace.



A LETTER FROM BISHOP OLMSTED



Bishop Thomas J. Olmsted's letter to the faithful regarding COVID-19 vaccinations and individual decisions based on a well-formed conscience



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We continue to experience the impact of the COVID-19 virus in many ways in our local community. As the number of cases and deaths are increasing with the most recent variant, we must rely on our faith in Jesus and the guidance of the Church to help us navigate these challenging times that have brought pain, confusion, and division. Let us remember always that it is Christ who heals and unites. We rely on His merciful and infinite love.

I want to once again express my gratitude to God for our first responders, medical professionals and public servants who work selflessly during these pandemic times for the common good. May they continue to be protected from the COVID-19 virus, be granted strength in their important work, and used as instruments of healing to those who are most in need. These have proven to be very trying times for those in these noble professions.

In December of 2020 after the release of the first vaccinations, I shared the following guidance: "Due to the serious nature of the pandemic, Catholics should prayerfully consider getting vaccinated and consult their physicians or health care providers for personalized medical information."

This guidance is given in concurrence with moral and scientific guidance of the Congregation of the Doctrine of Faith, the National Catholic Bioethics Center, and the Charlotte Lozier Institute which indicate that it is morally acceptable for a Catholic to receive certain vaccines. This message is consistent with guidance given by the Holy See and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. As Bishop of a diverse flock with the care of many souls, I continue to encourage the prayerful consideration that each individual must make in regard to receiving the vaccine. For those who have discerned to receive one, they can be assured that they can do so in good conscience. For those who have discerned not to receive one, they too can do so in good conscience. What is primary for us as individuals is to form our conscience through the teachings of the Church. The Catholic Catechism states:

"In all he says and does, man is obliged to follow faithfully what he knows to be just and right. It is by the judgment of his conscience that man perceives and recognizes the prescriptions of the divine law: 'Conscience is a law of the mind; yet [Christians] would not grant that it is nothing more; . . . [Conscience] is a messenger of him, who, both in nature and in grace, speaks to us behind a veil, and teaches and rules us by his representatives. Conscience is the aboriginal Vicar of Christ.'" (CCC 1778)

There have been many who have asked their pastors to grant them exemptions; however, it is employers who grant exemptions, not pastors. What we as the Church do is assist in forming the conscience and supporting the decision made by a conscience well formed. Employers and other institutions may require vaccination, but we support them reviewing and extending exemptions for personal religious reasons of conscience.

I encourage our priests, deacons and lay leaders to offer pastoral guidance to our people in the formation of conscience, using solid resources like those of the CDF, the NCBC, and the Catechism of the Catholic Church. In addition, please find a resource sheet attached. * I remind our Church leaders that it is not for us to make medical decisions for others but rather to support the right of faithful Catholics to come to a personal decision with the help of a well-formed conscience.

Catholics will differ in their discernment, each considering his or her own conscience. Let us respect and support one another and allow Christ to unite us through His mercy and care.

Let us plead to God for an end to this pandemic and for healing for all those suffering from COVID-19. We pray also for the eternal repose of those who have succumbed to the disease.

Asking Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. Joseph to pray for us, I entrust you all to the merciful love of our Savior Jesus Christ.
