PASTOR'S NOTES

Pride Comes Before the Fall

Dear Brothers and Sisters,



Is it okay to have some pride? Our Lord reminds us today that we are supposed to be humble? Humility is a virtue and it is the best virtue to fight against pride. But is all pride bad? For example, is it wrong to be proud of your children's accomplishments? Is it wrong to share the gifts God has given to you?

If you are blessed with musical or artistic talents, you have been given the chance to make the world a better place. Hiding your gifts or having false humility may keep someone from experiencing the goodness of God through your gifts. So, it is not good to hide your light under a bushel basket. Withholding your talents can lead you to become fake and that does not give honor and glory to God. Sharing your talents makes our world and the lives of those around you better.

There are certainly forms of pride that are bad. For example, many suffer from the kind of pride that tells them they are totally self-sufficient and they don't need God. That is the oldest trick of all. Satan told Adam and Eve that if they are of the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil they would be like God and who needs God is you can be a god yourself?

In the end, pride pushes God aside to make room for you and your ideas only. Pride affects your relationships with those around you. Ignoring pride leads one to a hell on earth by causing division and isolation. Remember, pride was Lucifer's downfall. Tragically, pride may keep a person away from confession. When one is suffering with pride, it becomes very difficult to admit sins to a priest. We have all heard people say, "I can confess to God without needing to go to a priest." Sadly, these people will eventually try to bargain with God by setting up their own terms for His forgiveness and even rationalizing their sins away.

Jesus said to His first priests, the apostles, "Whatsoever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatsoever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." When Jesus rose from the dead His first words to His apostles were "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven, and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained." Was Jesus speaking the truth? You know that answer. I realize that going to confession requires a great deal of humility. It is not usually easy to humble yourself. If you are having a difficult time going to confession, then pray. Ask God for the strength. God is waiting to offer you His mercy.

Here is the prayer I like to pray before confession: O loving and merciful God! help me to make a good Confession. Help me to examine my conscience, that I shall be able to tell the priest what sins I have committed and how often. Let me feel a deep sorrow for all my sins and give me the grace to firmly resolve not to sin again. O Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, my dear Guardian Angel, and all ye blessed Angels and Saints in Heaven, pray for me, that I shall make a good Confession, and from now on lead a good life, so that I shall join thee in Heaven to praise our dear Lord, forever and ever. *Our Father, Hail Mary*.

He Who Exalts Himself Will Be Humbled



Who wants to be last? Isn't it only natural to desire respect and esteem from others? Jesus' parable of the guests invited to the marriage feast probes our motives for seeking honor and position. Self-promotion is most often achieved at the expense of others! Jesus' parable reinforces the teaching of Proverbs: *Do not put yourself forward in the king's presence or stand in the place of the great; for it is better to be told, "Come up here," than to be put lower in the presence of the prince* (Proverbs 25:6-7).

True humility frees us to be our true selves as God sees us

What is true humility and why should we make it a characteristic mark of our life and action? True humility is not feeling bad about yourself, or having a low opinion of yourself, or thinking of yourself as inferior to others. True humility frees us from preoccupation with ourselves, whereas a low self-opinion tends to focus our attention on ourselves. Humility is truth in self-understanding and truth in action. Viewing ourselves truthfully, with sober judgment, means seeing ourselves the way God sees us (Psalm 139:1-4). A humble person makes a realistic assessment of himself or herself without illusion or pretense to be something he or she is not. The humble regard themselves neither smaller nor larger than they truly are.

True humility frees us to be our true selves and to avoid despair and pride. A humble person does not have to wear a mask or put on a facade in order to look good to others, especially to those who are not really familiar with that person. The humble are not swayed by accidentals, such as fame, reputation, success, or failure.

True humility frees us to love and serve selflessly for the good of others

Humility is the queen or foundation of all the other virtues because it enables us to view and judge ourselves correctly, the way God sees us. Humility leads to true self-knowledge, honesty, realism, strength, and dedication to give ourselves to something greater than ourselves. Humility frees us to love and serve others selflessly, for their sake, rather than our own. Paul the Apostles, gives us the greatest example and model of humility in the person of Jesus Christ, who *emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, …who humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross* (Philippians 2:7-8). The Lord Jesus gives grace to those who seek him humbly. Do you want to be a servant as Jesus served?

Lord Jesus, you became a servant for my sake to set me free from the tyranny of sin, selfishness, and conceit. Help me to be humble as you are humble and to love freely and graciously all whom you call me to serve. dailyscripture.org



Sign Before the Gospel

Question:

I have been going to Mass for years and have always wondered: why do we make the three signs of the cross before the Gospel?

Answer:

Certainly, many people go to Mass or other devotions, doing and saying things out of habit or reverses and not really understanding the reasons

habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind some of these things. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. A review of the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.

There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel: "May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart." In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel.
